

AGREEMENT

This Agreement ("Agreement") is entered on 1st day of Oct. 2016 ("Effective Date"), between Bureau Veritas Certification (India) Pvt. Ltd., a Company incorporated under the Companies Act. 1956, vide a certificate of incorporation bearing registration number 138108, issued by the Registrar of Companies. Shahu Institute of Business Education and Research, an Autonomous Institute under Shivaji University, (hereinafter referred to as 'CSIBER') whose registered address is :- Chh. Shahu Institute of Business Education and Research, Shivaji University Road, Kolhapur 416 004.

Hereinafter, BVCI and CSIBER are individually referred to as "Party" and collectively referred to as "Parties". WHEREAS:

- BVCI offers a wide range of training courses with instructors located all over India and globally as well. BVCI has developed/designed the Training Course by its team of industry experts. The training course is professional, progressive and updated with revisions to respective standards on a real time basis which enables and enhances the learning experiences of students/participants/delegates. (Herein after referred as "Customers") BVCI has been providing the Training Courses in open-house and in-house system
- 2) CSIBER provides training, consultancy and engineering services to their customers on information security.
- 3) BVCI desires to enter into a business relationship for furthering its business prospects by way of integrating the selling/marketing capabilities of CSIBER in the areas of exploring markets for the BVCI's Training Courses.
- 4) CSIBER may enter into, agreements with new and existing customers ("End Customers") on behalf of BVCI to deliver and implement BVCI's Training courses with BVCI's Tutors & Study Material and pursuant to which both the Parties shall enter into a mutually acceptable back to back statement of work ("SOW") with each other.

NOW THIS DEED WITNESSETH AND IT IS AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES HERETO AS FOLLOWS:

1) PURPOSE:

- (a) During the term of this Agreement, each Party agrees to perform its specific obligations hereunder and to act in good faith with respect to the other Party and in connection with any project/program pursued. To the extent required by a given project/program, each Party hereto shall combine its service offering with the other Party's service offering to offer a comprehensive solution to customers.
- (b) This Agreement must be signed by an authorized representative of each Party. BVCI shall have no obligation to commence performance of any Services until the Parties have executed this Agreement documenting the Services.

2) SCOPE OF WORK:

- (a) The scope of this agreement is limited to the courses delivered within India.
- (b) This Agreement is valid only for "In house" training courses. It means that these training courses not conducted for a specific organization, & these are publically announced / publicized courses where people from any organization are free to attend subject to terms & conditions laid down from time to time by BVCI & CSIBER.
- (c) Notwithstanding anything contained herein, BVCI shall be free to provide/conduct any "in house" or "open house" training courses covered under this agreement at its free will.

Service/Product, and (iv) make any representation, warranty or guarantee to Customers, potential Customers or individuals or entities within the industry with respect to the specifications, features or capabilities of BVCI or any BVCI Product that are inconsistent with the representations made by BVCI.

6) RESPONSIBILITY & OBLIGATION:

BVCI shall:

- (a) Provide lead tutors / support tutors as per IRCA/BVCI norms.
- (b) Maintain registration of courses with IRCA/BVCI.
- (c) Provide the course material to CSIBER as per sr No 9 below.
- (d) Ensure that IRCA certificates of achievement are awarded for successful delegates.
- (e) Ensure that certificates of attendance are provided for those delegates who do not pass the course.
- (f) Ensure that appropriate examination papers are provided to delegates for re-sit of those delegates who had not passed the examination the first time.

CSIBER shall:

- a) Market, organize and host the courses
- b) Register delegates.
- c) Manage all co-ordination and communication with the delegates (pre-course, collection of fees, handing over of certificates etc).
- d) Organize the course as per Sr. No 10 below.

7) TUTOR QUALIFICATION:

All tutors delivering the courses will be formally qualified by BVCI on the basis of the norms defined in BVCI's management system and IRCA requirements.

8) TRAINING COURSE SCHEDULING:

- (a) CSIBER shall schedule the "Inhouse" courses at least three months in advance. The course schedule shall be shown on the website of both the parties.
- (b) BVCI and CSIBER are free to publicize the course event / training calendar in their respective websites. However the description of the course meeting the accreditation body requirements must be complied by CSIBER as provided by BVCI.
- (c) For any course to be scheduled on an urgent basis, all efforts will be made by BVCI to provide tutor/s.
- (d) All courses scheduled by CSIBER shall be, by default, minimum 10 delegate's course and therefore, BVCI shall sign up a tutor for the said scheduled course.
- (e) In case CSIBER desires to host the course with more than 10 delegates, CSIBER shall convey for an additional BVCI's tutor at least 4 weeks in advance. In such cases, BVCI will make all efforts to arrange the second tutor.

9) COURSE STUDY MATERIAL & COURSE RECORDS:

- (a) BVCI shall provide adequate number of copies of the course material in hard copy format to CSIBER and CSIBER will organize for the logistics and distribution of these copies of the course material to delegates.
- (b) There shall be no changes made/alteration to BVCI's course material or delivery without prior written consent/permission of BVCI. The name of the course and course number, IRCA registration number and BVCI's name shall be associated with each course including the course binders.
- (c) At the end of the course, CSIBER shall submit all course records as per IRCA/BVCI requirements.

10) COURSE DELIVERY:

The Course shall be delivered by the tutors in accordance with BVCI norms, which are based on BMS and IRCA/BVCI requirements.

- (a) The course venue arrangements shall include:
 - A large training hall / room arranged as per "U' Shape or "Cluster shape" as requested by BVCI authorized executives / tutors to accommodate the expected number of delegates and tutors.
 - There have to be one or two separate rooms for case studies, group discussions and role plays etc. If such facility may not be existed/ available, then the Main training hall shall be sufficiently big enough to be converted into the group discussion room with 5 to 6 round tables, one for each group at a suitable distance so as to avoid disturbance between the groups during exercises.
 - Normal seating arrangements should ensure sufficient arm length/leg space for each delegate to be comfortable and at ease.
 - LCD Multimedia Projector and Screen
 - Overhead Projector, transparent plastic sheets and markers and / or
 - Flipchart and markers, Flip Chart boards
 - White board and markers
 - VCR and TV (if required)
 - Organise tea/coffee/refreshments/lunch during the course
 - Any other equipment which may be needed.
 - Organise for the logistics and distribution of the course material copies to delegates.
 - Provide necessary infrastructure for the delivery of the course (Course Venue, LCD & OHP projector, adequate number of white boards, flip chart boards, stationery, etc)- Also see clause no.
 6 of this agreement.
 - Organise for re-sit examinations for delegates who have not passed the course first time.
 - BVCI reserves the right to follow IRCA / BVCI's requirements related to audits and reviews
 of the course at the venue.
 - All courses shall be conducted during normal working hours (approximately from 09:00 hrs to 19:00 hrs). Any deviation required for course timings or any other arrangements require

written approval from IRCA through the BVCI authorized office and the course shall not proceed until such approval is obtained.

CSIBER shall submit a list or training venues to BVCI at the beginning of each year.

11) DELEGATE ASSESSMENT AND EXAMINATION:

- (a) The delegate assessment and examination shall be conducted in accordance with BVCI norms, which are based on IRCA/BVCI requirements.
- (b) Details of the continuous assessment and examination will be shared by the tutors in each course.
- (c) Delegates who do not pass the continuous assessment shall be required to re-appear for the entire course; those who do not pass the examination can appear for a re-sit within 12 months of the course. Only one re-sit is permitted.

12) CERTFICATE ISSUE:

- (a) The delegates passing the course shall be awarded with a IRCA/BVCI certificate of achievement, as per the approved IRCA/BVCI design.
- (b) For BVCI Courses certificates shall be issued with joint signatories of BVCI and CSIBER.
- (c) The delegates not passing the course shall be awarded with a certificate of attendance with the BVCI logo as the course provider.
- (d) For transition course only certification of attendance would be issued in the IRCA approved format.

13) REMUNERATION AND OTHER FEES:

- CSIBER shall pay BVCI the following sums as per the ANNEXURE A
 - (a) For courses held within Kolhapur, expenses related to the transport, accommodation and local conveyance for the tutor/s would be borne by CSIBER.
 - (b) Both parties reserve the right to revise the fees from time to time, keeping in mind market factors, general inflation, costs, however any changes would be communicated & should be mutually agreed by both the parties in writing.

14) COMPLAINT HANDLING:

If any complaints are received at either BVCI or CSIBER from organizations / participants, BVCI will formally register the complaint. The necessary analysis and corrective action will be taken either by BVCI or CSIBER based on the responsibility and accountability of the activity on which the complaint has been raised.

15) INVOICING:

BVCI shall raise invoice with all applicable fees and charges in INR, after each course as per commercial terms stipulated under para 13 above. Invoice shall be paid by CSIBER within 7 days from the DATE OF INVOICE.

16) Other terms and conditions:

- (a) BVCI shall inform CSIBER, IRCA/BVCI's requirements related to advertising and publicity of the courses and CSIBER shall ensure compliance to the same.
- (b) BVCI shall provide CSIBER with BVCI' logo and its usage guidelines. CSIBER shall use the BVCI' logo (in AS IS condition) in the promotional material developed for the Product.
- (c) Where the number of delegates is 11 to 20, the Course must be run with 2 Tutors.
- (d) CSIBER agrees that the course material provided by BVCI shall be used only for courses covered under the scope of this contract. These shall not be shared with any other agency/institution/organization in India or abroad. BVCI shall be free to terminate the agreement unilaterally, in case of violation of this clause is detected. CSIBER's right to use the course material will cease at the termination of this agreement. CSIBER shall be obliged to return all copies of material, to BVCI, in case of such termination.
- (e) At no point of time, CSIBER shall seek soft copy of material from either tutors or any other entities. Such requests if made verbally or in writing shall be treated as breach of this contract and shall attract termination of this Agreement.
- (f) Neither party shall disclose any information relating to or belonging to the other, to any third party without written permission. This condition would survive the expiry or the termination of this agreement.
- (g) In the event of a difference in interpretation of this Agreement between BVCI and CSIBER, an independent arbitrator, acceptable to both parties, shall give ruling in the matter. The ruling shall be binding on both the parties.
- (h) Both Parties will nominate representatives who shall co-ordinate all communication between the Parties on planning and conduct of courses.
- (i) CSIBER shall freely consent for witness of any course at any point of time by accreditation bodies for which BVCI will intimate CSIBER in advance.
- (j) CSIBER shall commit and deliver a minimum of 1 course of 60 Students (Batch of 20 Students per course) or 3 courses of 20 participants per course for IMS (EMS-14001:2015 & BS OHSAS 18001:2007) and QMS 9001:2015 internal auditor and batch of 10 participants for any Lead Auditor Program within Kolhapur within the defined scope as per Clause No. 1 of this agreement, during the validity of this contract failing which BVCI has the right to terminate the contract. At other locations, both BVCI and CSIBER will endeavor to conduct maximum number of courses, but both parties will share their training plans with each other so as not to jeopardize each other's business prospects.

17) Copyright:

- (a) BVCI shall prepare the course notes, case study materials, etc., for each course. All documentation relating to the course is copyright under the Indian Copyright Law and remains the sole property of BVCI. On ceasing of the Agreement, all materials in possession of CSIBER, shall be returned to BVCI.
- (b) Such materials are to be used to assist the tutors in running the courses which are subject to this Agreement and are not to be made available in any verbal, visual, written or electronic form to third party individuals or organization for any reason without the prior written agreement of BVCI.
- (c) No ownership of any intellectual property rights to the Training and/or Study Material is transferred to hereunder, all of which rights shall remain with BVCI or the applicable third party owner. BVCI further retains all proprietary rights, including any patent rights, trade secret rights, copyrights and trademark rights in and to any data, records, processes, models, samples, software, designs, engineering details, schematics, drawings and other documentation pertaining to the Training and/or Study Material and which are provided to CSIBER pursuant to this Agreement (the "Proprietary Information"). Reseller acknowledges and agrees that Reseller has no proprietary rights by virtue of this Agreement, except those contractual rights that are expressly set forth herein.
- (d) CSIBER shall not alter, modify, reproduce or create derivative works from the Training and/or Study Material, the Software, books or any part thereof sold under this Agreement. CSIBER shall not, directly or indirectly, sell the Training and/or Study Material to customers whom BVCI knows or has reason to know intend to resell the Products. CSIBER agrees not to reverse engineer, decompile, or disassemble the Training and/or Study Material or otherwise reduce the Training and/or Study Material/Software to human-perceivable form, or to encourage or assist third parties in doing so.

18) Force Majeure:

Either party shall not be liable in any respect should it be prevented from discharging its services as a result of any matter beyond its control which could not be reasonably foreseen.

19) Indemnity:

Each Party (Indemnifying Party) willfully and effectually indemnify the other Party (Indemnified Party) against all costs, claims, actions and demands arising from:

- -Claims from the neglect of obligations by the Indemnifying Party, its employees or agents;
- -The use or misuse of any certificate provided by Bureau Veritas Certification in accordance with this Agreement; and
- -Any breach of this Agreement by Indemnifying Party; and illness, injury or death to the Indemnified Party's subcontractors or suppliers, together with any of their employees, agents or directors ("group"); and Damage to or loss of property or equipment owned, leased or used by the group

20) LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

In no event shall either Party be liable for any incidental, indirect, special or consequential damages in connection with or arising from this Agreement. BVCI's maximum aggregate liability for a proven breach of this Agreement shall at no time exceed the value of the particular SOW of this agreement attracting such liability.

21) CONFIDENTIALITY OBLIGATIONS

- (a) All of the confidential or proprietary information which any Party to this Agreement ("Disclosing Party") furnishes or makes available to the other Party ("Receiving Party") or which Receiving Party observes, discovers, obtains and/or develops in during the performance of this Agreement shall be treated, maintained and held by the Receiving Party as confidential information of the Disclosing Party, whether furnished before or after the date of this Agreement, whether tangible or intangible and whatever form or medium provided ("Confidential Information"). Receiving Party shall not disclose or use any Confidential Information for any purpose other than in the performance of this Agreement without the Disclosing Party's prior written consent in each instance.
- (b) Notwithstanding the foregoing prohibition on disclosure, Receiving Party may disclose Confidential Information to its employees and counsel, if disclosure is required in connection with Receiving Party's provisioning of services under this Agreement and such persons agree in writing to be bound by the terms of this paragraph and to use Confidential Information only for the purposes expressed herein. If any such person discloses or uses Confidential Information in a manner not permitted hereunder, Receiving Party shall be liable therefore whether or not, at the time of such breach, the individual is employed by the Receiving Party. Receiving Party agrees, at its sole expense, to take all reasonable measures (including, but not limited to, court proceedings) to restrain its employees or former employees, as the case may be, from prohibited or unauthorized disclosure or use of Confidential Information. Receiving Party understands that Disclosing Party is not making any representation or warranty of any kind as to the accuracy or completeness of the Confidential Information disclosed hereunder. Disclosing Party shall not incur any liability on the basis of Receiving Party's use of Confidential Information.
- (c) Receiving Party may also disclose Confidential Information if it is required to do so by applicable statute, rule, regulation or judicial or administrative process or order; provided, however, that Receiving Party shall promptly notify Disclosing Party of any such requirement so that Receiving Party or Disclosing Party or both may seek (i) to take legally available steps to narrow such request, (ii) to furnish only such portion of the Confidential Information as, in written opinion of counsel satisfactory to Disclosing Party, it is legally compelled to disclose, and (iii) to seek an appropriate protective order.

- (d) Upon the expiration or earlier termination of this Agreement, Receiving Party shall return all originals and copies of any Confidential Information to Disclosing Party or, with respect to copies, shall certify to Disclosing Party that all copies of Confidential Information in Receiving Party's control have been destroyed within ten (10) days after Disclosing Party's request. Expiration or earlier termination of this Agreement, or any other agreement between the Parties, shall not affect the restriction on disclosure or use of any Confidential Information disclosed hereunder.
- (e) In the event of a breach or threatened breach by Receiving Party of the provisions of this Section. Disclosing Party shall be entitled to an injunction or injunctions restraining Receiving Party from disclosing, in whole or in part, any such Confidential Information or from rendering any service to any third party to whom the Confidential Information, in whole or in part, has been disclosed or to whom Receiving Party is threatening to disclose the same and/or to compel specific performance of this Agreement, and Receiving Party agrees that it shall not oppose the granting of such relief to the extent permitted by applicable law, and Receiving Party hereby irrevocably waives any defense that it might have based on the adequacy of a remedy at law which might be asserted as a bar to such remedy of specific performance or injunctive relief. Receiving Party also agrees to reimburse Disclosing Party for all costs and expenses, including attorneys' fees, incurred by Disclosing Party in attempting to enforce the obligations of Receiving Party hereunder. Nothing herein shall be construed as prohibiting Disclosing Party from pursuing any other remedies available to Disclosing Party for such breach or threatened breach, including the recovery of damages. Any breach of this Section shall be a material breach of this Agreement.
- (f) The terms of this Agreement, but not its existence, shall be the Confidential Information of the parties. In that regard, during the term of this Agreement and for a period of five (5) years thereafter, neither Party shall disclose any terms or conditions of this Agreement to any third Party without the prior consent of the other Party. Notwithstanding the foregoing, each Party may disclose the terms and conditions of this Agreement to investment bankers, investors, and potential investors provided that each recipient is bound by similar obligations of confidentiality and non-use at least as protective as those set forth in this clause.

In keeping with the overall vision, TISS and the CSIBER will work together to impart the course with academic rigor combined with practical work.

CSIBER will -

- Provide a competent staff to coordinate the programme who will be called a Programme Coordinator.
- Provide faculty to teach the courses in the programme
- Provide infrastructure and administrative support to conduct the Certificate & Diploma in Youth Leadership and Social Change.
- Select and Network with agencies for field placement of the students before and during the programme.
- Conduct assessment of students in partnership with TISS.
- Be one of the joint signatories on the Certificate / Diploma along with TISS.
- · Give testimonials to the students who successfully fulfill all requirements.

TISS will -

- Nominate an anchor person who will be the one point contact for CSIBER.
- Guide CSIBER for conducting the Certificate & Diploma in Youth Leadership and Social Change.
- Provide expert faculty to conduct sessions to strengthen the academic base of the programme.
- Monitor the courses and give suggestions on improvement to meet high standards of academic excellence.
- Provide academic inputs about the courses in whatever manner as it deems fit.
- Oversee assessment of students along with CSIBER.
- Act as co-signatory on the certificates given to the students along with CSIBER.

Domain

TISS will provide domain knowledge and expertise related to the Knowledge Certificate & Diploma in Youth Leadership and Social Change.

IV Rules & Regulations

This MOU will be governed by the rules & regulations hereunder & shall be read & form part & parcel of this MOU.

V Use of Logo



Advertisement

CSIBER and TISS will take the responsibility for spreading information about the course within their networks and partners through pamphlets, brochures, advertisements and other publicity materials as considered necessary

Co-brand

"co-brand" releases, presentations and Partner TISS and CSIBER will all Organisation logo; with all logos of equal size and prominence. Further co-branding with other donors, supporters or partners such as government ministries is acceptable with the express, prior written approval of TISS. Branding is not required on publications submitted to peer-reviewed journals or conferences.

Use of Logo

CSIBER or TISS shall not include logo of the other partner or refer to this collaboration for any other purpose except that connected to the course on Certificate & Diploma in Youth Leadership and Social Change in any statement or material of publicity or promotional nature issued for purposes of financial benefit or gain ("Commercial purposes").

VI Infrastructure

Cost

The entire cost of infrastructure required for running the Course will be borne by CSIBER.

Basic Facilities

VII Period of MOU

New Centers

IX Breach of Trust

Breach Of Trust

Any other course of similar nature to be conducted in partnership with any other agency by **CSIBER** has to be done only after mutual discussion and agreement with TISS or it will be regarded as breach of trust.

X Intellectual Property Rights:

Copyright

TISS will reserve the authorization to the copyright of all study a training material, monitoring application software and other material developed for the courses.

XI Confidentiality

Disclosure

Except as may be expressly required by TISS neither CSIBER nor any persons or retained by it shall disclose or make available to any third party, any information concerning the terms of this agreement, or any confidential or proprietary materials to which it may have gained access, or any information or data concerning any aspects of the Disclosing Party, an affiliate of the Disclosing Party or their operations, existing or future business dealings, or any other information regarding their services.

XII Termination

Notice

Any of the parties to this understanding may terminate this Memorandum of Understanding by giving 30 (thirty) days notice in writing to the other party. However, the collaboration will terminate after the completion of the Course which may be running at the time and the declaration of its results.

XIII Legal Obligation

Dispute Resolution

Any legal dispute arising out of the implementation of this agreement will be Mutually settled as part of equal responsibility of both, the TISS and Partner Organisation. The Director, TISS will have the authority to suggest change or modify any clause of this agreement, in consultation with the Chairperson, Centre for Lifelong Learning and / or the Advisory Committee, Centre for Lifelong Learning, keeping the students

XIV Indemnity Clause

Both parties shall hold harmless, and indemnify the other Party and its directors, officers, agents and employees against any and all loss, liability, damage, or expenses, including any direct, indirect or consequential loss, liability, damage, or expense, but not including attorney's fees unless awarded by a court of competent jurisdiction, for injury or death to persons, including employees of either Party, and damage to property, including property of either Party, arising out of or in connection with intentional, willful, wanton, reckless or negligent conduct. However, neither Party shall be indemnified here under for any loss, liability, damage, or expense resulting from its sole negligence or willful misconduct.

XV Arbitration

Governance

This agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of India.

Resolving Amicably

All and any disputes or differences or claims whatsoever which shall at any time hereafter (whether during the continuance of this agreement or upon or after its discharge or determination or termination) arise between the Parties hereto or their respective heirs, legal representatives successors - in -title, transferee's and permitted assigns (as the case may be), touching, concerning or relating to the subject matter hereof, or the meaning or interpretation of this agreement, or arising out these presents or as to the consideration, meaning or effect hereof or as to the rights, duties, obligations, responsibilities or liabilities of the Parties hereto or any of them, or any purported termination of this agreement or otherwise, or as to any other matter in any way connected with or arising out of or in relation to the subject matter of this agreement, shall, without recourse to arbitration, at first instance, be settled amicably between the senior representatives of the Parties Should such dispute, differences or claim remains unresolved beyond thirty (30) days of the date on which it was so referred to by one Party to the other, then the other Party may refer such dispute, difference or claim to be finally settled by Arbitration to be held in Mumbai in accordance with the provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 (as amended).

Arbitration

The Arbitration Tribunal shall consist of the sole arbitrator to be nominated by TISS. The Arbitration Tribunal may lay down, from time to time, the procedure to be followed by him in conducting the arbitration proceedings and shall conduct arbitration proceedings in such manner as he considers appropriate.

RULES & EGULATIONS

These Rules shall be called the Rules of Centre for Lifelong Learning, TISS.

Subject to the provisions of the Regulations & the Rules of the Commission, the Governing Board members shall, in addition to all other powers vested in it, have the power to frame the Rules of the Centre that may provide for all or any of the following matters.

I. Administrative

Steering Committee

A Steering Committee will be formed immediately after signing of the MoU which will be responsible for setting policy guidelines, monitoring and supervision of the courses. The Steering Committee will comprise of five members in all: one anchor person will be appointed for the course from TISS and one anchor person from CSIBER There will be two experts on Certificate & Diploma in Youth Leadership and Social Change (The substantive area) and the fifth member will be the Programme Coordinator. One of the two experts should preferably be an academician.

Experts

The experts will be nominated by the President/Secretary of **CSIBER** and the Chairperson of Centre for Lifelong Learning. The experts should have at least three years of experience in training, research or consultancy in the sector – Viz. Certificate & Diploma in Youth Leadership and Social Change (the substantive area)

Tenure

The appointment of the Steering Committee will be for a two year period subject to renewal. The experts will contribute to enrich the curriculum and courses offered to the students as well as contribute to drafting the policy guidelines for the courses.

II. Role of the members of the Steering Committee

Responsibility

The Steering Committee will be responsible for designing the overall policy framework to run the course. This includes:

- Policies related to student mobilisation, admissions and attendance
- Overall framework for curriculum implementation and review whenever required.
- Faculty appointment and setting overall teaching standards for the course
- Designing student assessment framework and certification
- Designing criteria for selection of field placement agencies and final placement of students
- Any other area for policy making related to effective implementation of the course
- Procedures to be observed at any meeting of any authority or any committee.
- Prescribing persons such as other officers for the Centre.
- Creation, composition and functions of any committee or body, which is considered necessary for the work of the Diploma Programme Procedures for preparation and submission of budget.
- Procedure for convening of the steering meeting for the programme.
- Preparation of minutes of the steering committee meetings and forwarding these

to President/ Secretary/Partner Organisation and Chairperson, CLL.

III. Decision Power of the Steering Committee

All the decisions which are in the nature of execution of above policies will be taken by the Steering Committee.

This includes:

- i. Interview and selection of candidates
- ii. Disqualification of students
- iii. Curriculum Review in consultation with Advisory Committee of Centre for Lifelong Learning
- iv. Settlement of any disputes regarding student's assessment by the faculty
- v. Monitoring teaching quality and taking necessary action if and when required
- vi. Approving the field placement agencies

IV. Meetings

Quorum

The meetings of the Steering Committee will be held at least once in four months. Any of the anchor persons from TISS or CSIBER can call an emergency meeting in case of matters of urgent importance. At least three members need to be present for all important decisions related to the course. In case of disagreement, the decision will be taken by a simple majority.

Anchor

The anchor person on behalf of TISS from Center for Lifelong Learning will be Dr. Saigita Chitturu and the anchor person from CSIBER will be Dr. D.N. Valvi.

Supervision

Every quarter the anchor person from TISS will visit CSIBER Training Center from where the course will be run. Day-to-day supervision will be by the Course Co-coordinator appointed by CSIBER.

Prospectus

CSIBER will take responsibility for designing and printing of prospectus and application form. Both the prospectus as well as Application form will have logo of CSIBER and TISS on left and right hand corner respectively.

V. Course Fee

Separate Account

The course fee / cost per student will be decided and reviewed by the Steering Committee and will be more or less at par with TISS fee structure. The Course fee amount will be collected by CSIBER which will maintain separate accounts for the same.

Fees/Cost per Student

The course fee for this Certificate in Youth Leadership & Social Change is 11000/- and Diploma in Youth Leadership and Social Change is 21,000/-. The Course Fee will

cover all expenses of teaching, reading material etc. The Programm Co-ordinator will be paid by **CSIBER** as per existing norms.

Sharing

TISS and CSIBER_will jointly decide on an amount to be shared equally for administrative work including holding meetings, travel for monitoring and field visits, assessments, trainings etc.

TISS Charges

From the CSIBER TISS will receive at least Rs.3000/- per student irrespective of the fee charged by them. If no fee is charged then these charges will be based upon the cost per student as stated in the budget. Where the fees / amount per student is above Rs.10,000/-, the partner organization will pay 20 per cent of the total fee collected. Whichever is higher will prevail. The amount will be paid within 45 working days from the start of the course.

Review

The fee structure will be reviewed on an annual basis by the Advisory Committee of Centre for Lifelong Learning (CLL) in consultation with the Steering Committee and approval of Academic Council.

VI. Academic

Criteria for Selection

Criteria for selection of the students will be as approved for the Certificate / Diploma by the Academic Council of TISS. The current criterion for admission is minimum. Reservations for SC/ST/OBC according to the norms of University Grant Commission will be binding

Final Selection

The anchor person from TISS as well as from CSIBER will be involved in final selection of the students. In case interviews are necessary, the interview panel will have representation from both TISS & CSIBER unless otherwise decided by the Steering Committee. The decision to disqualify or rusticate a student will be taken by the Steering Committee.

Course Content

The course content for the Certificate & Diploma in Youth Leadership and Social Change has been approved by the Advisory Committee of Center for Lifelong Learning and / or the Academic Council of TISS. In case any changes in the curriculum are required, the members of Steering Committee or CLL Advisory Committee can call for a meeting not later than three months before the start of the first semester, of the course.

Responsibility

TISS will guide CSIBER in preparing the academic calendar and Partner Organisation will implement the calender.

Policy for Placement

The policy for placement will be jointly designed by TISS and CSIBER and

has to be approved by the Steering Committee. Field placement and final placement of students will be the responsibility of CSIBER TISS can suggest agencies within its network for placement of students.

Quality of teacher

A mechanism to monitor the quality of teachers will be suggested by the Steering Committee and implemented by CSIBER.

Moderation Committee

A Moderation Committee responsible for monitoring the field work of the students will be formed by CSIBER which will involve field supervisors and the Programme Coordinator of CSIBER

Assessment

The method of assessment of students will be decided by the respective faculty. However, the number of assessment units, weightage per assessment unit, grading scheme and requirement for credit fulfillment in any course will be based on TISS assessment norms. The question papers will be set by the faculty and approved by the anchor person from CSIBER and TISS

Access to TISS Library

Faculty of the Certificate & Diploma in Youth Leadership and Social Change will have access to TISS library and will be able to use the resources of the library to enrich the content of the courses.

VII. Interpretation Clause

Clauses

In the event of conflict of opinion with regard to interpretation of Regulations or the Rules of the School, the opinion of Director, TISS shall be final. In the event of a conflict of opinion with regard to interpretation of the agreement or these Rules and Regulations or the Bye Laws, the opinion of the Governing Board Member of TISS shall prevail.

VIII. Amendment of Rules

Rules

These Rules and Regulations of the Centre may be altered, varied, extended, revoked or abridged at any time by resolutions passed by a majority of the members of the Governing Board, present at the meetings of the Governing Board; which shall have been duly convened for the purpose, and the procedures followed as laid down in Section 12 of the Societies Registration Act 1860 (XXI of 1860); after receipt of concurrence of the UGC and the Institute

IX Institute to be a Juristic Person

Judicial Role

The Tata Institute of Social Sciences shall be a juristic person and shall have a perpetual succession, as also a common seal, and will sue and be sued in its own name.

X Institute Open to all classes, creeds and castes

Equality

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN

Chhatrapati Shahu Institute of Business Education and Research (CSIBER) D.K. Shinde School of Social Work, India AND

ARIZONA STATE UNIVERSITY

CSIBER D.K. Shinde School of Social Work, India ("<u>CSIBER</u>") and the Arizona Board of Regents for and on behalf of Arizona State University and its College of Health Solutions, Arizona, USA ("<u>ASU</u>"), recognizing the benefits to their respective universities from the establishment of international links, conclude this Memorandum of Understanding ("<u>MOU</u>").

- 1. The purpose of this MOU is to promote international understanding and collaboration between CSIBER and ASU regarding educational, research and professional activities.
- 2. CSIBER and ASU will endeavor to develop the following collaborative activities in academic areas of mutual interest, on a basis of equality and reciprocity.
 - (1) Exchange of staff and researchers
 - (2) Exchange of students
 - (3) Conducting collaborative research projects
 - (4) Conducting lectures and organizing symposia
 - (5) Exchange of academic information and materials
 - (6) Promoting other academic cooperation as mutually agreed
 - (7) Presenting research in conferences in India and the USA
- 3. Each collaborative activity will be preceded by detailed discussions between the parties and a legally binding agreement that addresses information pertaining to such activity, including (as applicable) statement of work, duration, cost, intellectual property rights and other necessary terms for international cooperative activities. Each separate agreement will be in writing and signed by authorized representatives of CSIBER and ASU.
- 4. It is understood that the implementation of any types of cooperation stated in clause 2 shall depend upon the availability of resources and financial support at CSIBER and ASU. This MOU does not represent any commitment with regard to funding on the part of the parties or an obligation to find any funds. Each cooperative activity undertaken by the parties under this MOU will be subject to

the finances available at each party for the type of activity undertaken and by such other financial assistance as may be obtained by each party from external sources.

- 5. Each party is an independent contractor and is independent of the other party. This MOU does not create a partnership, joint venture or agency relationship of any kind between the parties. This MOU is not intended to and does not create any rights, benefits or legal obligations (substantive or procedural), enforceable at law or in equity, by either party, its officers, employees or agents against the other party, its officers, employees or agents. Each party acknowledges that the relationship of the parties under this MOU is non-exclusive. Each party will be responsible for the negligence, acts and omissions of its employees and agents when acting under such party's direction and supervision.
- 6. Each party appoints the following individuals to provide oversight for the collaboration, resolving issues as they arise. All notices and other communications hereunder will be given in writing to the individuals named below and will be: (a) personally delivered; (b) sent via email or other electronic means; or (c) sent by commercial overnight courier service. - 14. The parties recognize that performance of this MOU by ASU may be dependent upon the appropriation of funds by the State Legislature of Arizona (the "Legislature"). If the Legislature fails to appropriate the necessary funds, then by written notice to CSIBER, ASU may cancel this MOU without further duty or obligation. CSIBER recognizes and understands that appropriation is a legislative act and is beyond the control of ASU.
- 15. Both parties recognize that as a state institution in Arizona, ASU is bound by provisions of Arizona law, and CSIBER is subject to provisions of the laws of India. Notice is provided of Arizona

Preamble

COLFAPINATIONS.

The Centre for Lifelong Learning at TISS has been involved in the area of Youth since the year 2013-14. The Diploma Programme in Youth Development and Social Change conducted by the CLL has been playing a vital role in training those engaging with youth, and youth themselves, in order to maximize social change through youth development and empowerment. After reviewing the scope of our work and exploring the possibility of maximum impact, the need has been felt to make Youth education more accessible to prospective students who otherwise are unable to gain the training due to restrictions of language, location and money. Hence, the Centre has decided to work in collaboration with other institutions like CSIBER and agencies that share similar vision of Youth education. Thus, the tested curriculum of the Certificate & Diploma in Youth Development and Social Change can be taught by competent institutions (here CSIBER) in collaboration with CLL.



II Overarching Vision of the TISS & CSIBER

Vision

- Provide infrastructure and administrative support to conduct the Certificate & Diploma in Youth Leadership and Social Change.
- Select and Network with agencies for field placement of the students before and during the programme.
- Conduct assessment of students in partnership with TISS.
- Be one of the joint signatories on the Certificate / Diploma along with TISS.
- Give testimonials to the students who successfully fulfill all requirements.

TISS will -

- Nominate an anchor person who will be the one point contact for CSIBER.
- Guide CSIBER for conducting the Certificate & Diploma in Youth Leadership and Social Change.
- Provide expert faculty to conduct sessions to strengthen the academic base of the programme.
- Monitor the courses and give suggestions on improvement to meet high standards of academic excellence.
- · Provide academic inputs about the courses in whatever manner as it deems fit.
- Oversee assessment of students along with CSIBER.
- Act as co-signatory on the certificates given to the students along with CSIBER.

Domain

TISS will provide domain knowledge and expertise related to the Knowledge **Certificate** & **Diploma in Youth Leadership and Social Change.**

IV Rules & Regulations

This MOU will be governed by the rules & regulations hereunder & shall be read & form part & parcel of this MOU.

V Use of Logo



Advertisement

CSIBER and TISS will take the responsibility for spreading information about the course within their networks and partners through pamphlets, brochures, advertisements and other publicity materials as considered necessary

Co-brand

TISS **CSIBER** will "co-brand" all releases, presentations and Partner and Organisation logo; with all logos of equal size and prominence. Further co-branding with other donors, supporters or partners such as government ministries is acceptable with the express, prior written approval of TISS. Branding is not required on publications submitted to peer-reviewed journals or conferences.

Use of Logo

CSIBER or TISS shall not include logo of the other partner or refer to this collaboration for any other purpose except that connected to the course on Certificate & Diploma in Youth Leadership and Social Change in any statement or material of publicity or promotional nature issued for purposes of financial benefit or gain ("Commercial purposes").

VI Infrastructure

Cost

The entire cost of infrastructure required for running the Course will be borne by CSIBER.

Basic Facilities

CSIBER will be responsible for providing basic facilities like library, computers, tables, chairs and all teaching material required for conducting classes.

Accommodation

CSIBER will arrange for accommodation facilities on demand and paid basis where necessary.

VII Period of MOU

Tenure

VIII Opening of new centers

New Centers

In case the demand to run similar courses comes up from other regions, the decision for the same will be taken by the Steering Committee after consultation with the Director, TISS and the Advisory Committee of Center for Lifelong learning.

IX Breach of Trust

Breach Of Trust

Any other course of similar nature to be conducted in partnership with any other agency by **CSIBER** has to be done only after mutual discussion and agreement with TISS or it will be regarded as breach of trust.

X Intellectual Property Rights:

Copyright

TISS will reserve the authorization to the copyright of all study a training material, monitoring application software and other material developed for the courses.

XI Confidentiality

Disclosure

Except as may be expressly required by TISS neither CSIBER nor any persons or retained by it shall disclose or make available to any third party, any information concerning the terms of this agreement, or any confidential or proprietary materials to which it may have gained access, or any information or data concerning any aspects of the Disclosing Party, an affiliate of the Disclosing Party or their operations, existing or future business dealings, or any other information regarding their services.

XII Termination

Notice

Any of the parties to this understanding may terminate this Memorandum of Understanding by giving 30 (thirty) days notice in writing to the other party. However, the collaboration will terminate after the completion of the Course which may be running at the time and the declaration of its results.

XIII Legal Obligation

Dispute Resolution

Any legal dispute arising out of the implementation of this agreement will be Mutually settled as part of equal responsibility of both, the TISS and Partner Organisation. The Director, TISS will have the authority to suggest change or modify any clause of this agreement, in consultation with the Chairperson, Centre for Lifelong Learning and / or the Advisory Committee, Centre for Lifelong Learning, keeping the students concern or mutual interest of the collaborating partners in mind.

XIV Indemnity Clause

Both parties shall hold harmless, and indemnify the other Party and its directors, officers, agents and employees against any and all loss, liability, damage, or expenses, including any direct, indirect or consequential loss, liability, damage, or expense, but not including attorney's fees unless awarded by a court of competent jurisdiction, for injury or death to persons, including employees of either Party, and damage to property, including property of either Party, arising out of or in connection with intentional, willful, wanton, reckless or negligent conduct. However, neither Party shall be indemnified here under for any loss, liability, damage, or expense resulting from its sole negligence or willful misconduct.

XV Arbitration

Governance

This agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of India.

Resolving Amicably

All and any disputes or differences or claims whatsoever which shall at any time hereafter (whether during the continuance of this agreement or upon or after its discharge or determination or termination) arise between the Parties hereto or their respective heirs, legal representatives successors - in -title, transferee's and permitted assigns (as the case may be),touching, concerning or relating to the subject matter hereof, or the meaning or interpretation of this agreement, or arising out these presents or as to the consideration, meaning or effect hereof or as to the rights, duties, obligations, responsibilities or liabilities of the Parties hereto or any of them, or any purported termination of this agreement or otherwise, or as to any other matter in any way connected with or arising out of or in relation to the subject matter of this agreement. shall, without recourse to arbitration, at first instance, be settled amicably between the senior representatives of the Parties Should such dispute, differences or claim remains unresolved beyond thirty (30) days of the date on which it was so referred to by one Party to the other, then the other Party may refer such dispute, difference or claim to be finally settled by Arbitration to be held in Mumbai in accordance with the provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 (as amended).

Arbitration

The Arbitration Tribunal shall consist of the sole arbitrator to be nominated by TISS. The Arbitration Tribunal may lay down, from time to time, the procedure to be followed by him in conducting the arbitration proceedings and shall conduct arbitration proceedings in such manner as he considers appropriate.

RULES & EGULATIONS

These Rules shall be called the Rules of Centre for Lifelong Learning, TISS.

Subject to the provisions of the Regulations & the Rules of the Commission, the Governing Board members shall, in addition to all other powers vested in it, have the power to frame the Rules of the Centre that may provide for all or any of the following matters.

I. Administrative

Steering Committee

A Steering Committee will be formed immediately after signing of the MoU which will be responsible for setting policy guidelines, monitoring and supervision of the courses. The Steering Committee will comprise of five members in all: one anchor person will be appointed for the course from TISS and one anchor person from CSIBER There will be two experts on Certificate & Diploma in Youth Leadership and Social Change (The substantive area) and the fifth member will be the Programme Coordinator. One of the two experts should preferably be an academician.

Experts

The experts will be nominated by the President/Secretary of **CSIBER** and the Chairperson of Centre for Lifelong Learning. The experts should have at least three years of experience in training, research or consultancy in the sector – Viz. Certificate & Diploma in Youth Leadership and Social Change (the substantive area)

Tenure

The appointment of the Steering Committee will be for a two year period subject to renewal. The experts will contribute to enrich the curriculum and courses offered to the students as well as contribute to drafting the policy guidelines for the courses.

II. Role of the members of the Steering Committee

Responsibility

The Steering Committee will be responsible for designing the overall policy framework to run the course. This includes:

- Policies related to student mobilisation, admissions and attendance
- Overall framework for curriculum implementation and review whenever required.
- Faculty appointment and setting overall teaching standards for the course
- Designing student assessment framework and certification
- Designing criteria for selection of field placement agencies and final placement of students
- Any other area for policy making related to effective implementation of the course
- Procedures to be observed at any meeting of any authority or any committee.
- Prescribing persons such as other officers for the Centre.
- Creation, composition and functions of any committee or body, which is considered necessary for the work of the Diploma Programme Procedures for preparation and submission of budget.
- Procedure for convening of the steering meeting for the programme.
- Preparation of minutes of the steering committee meetings and forwarding these

to President/ Secretary/Partner Organisation and Chairperson, CLL.

III. Decision Power of the Steering Committee

All the decisions which are in the nature of execution of above policies will be taken by the Steering Committee.

This includes:

- i. Interview and selection of candidates
- ii. Disqualification of students
- iii. Curriculum Review in consultation with Advisory Committee of Centre for Lifelong Learning
- iv. Settlement of any disputes regarding student's assessment by the faculty
- v. Monitoring teaching quality and taking necessary action if and when required
- vi. Approving the field placement agencies

IV. Meetings

Quorum

The meetings of the Steering Committee will be held at least once in four months. Any of the anchor persons from TISS or CSIBER can call an emergency meeting in case of matters of urgent importance. At least three members need to be present for all important decisions related to the course. In case of disagreement, the decision will be taken by a simple majority.

Anchor

The anchor person on behalf of TISS from Center for Lifelong Learning will be Dr. Saigita Chitturu and the anchor person from CSIBER will be Dr. D.N. Valvi.

Supervision

Every quarter the anchor person from TISS will visit CSIBER Training Center from where the course will be run. Day-to-day supervision will be by the Course Co-coordinator appointed by CSIBER.

Prospectus

CSIBER will take responsibility for designing and printing of prospectus and application form. Both the prospectus as well as Application form will have logo of CSIBER and TISS on left and right hand corner respectively.

V. Course Fee

Separate Account

The course fee / cost per student will be decided and reviewed by the Steering Committee and will be more or less at par with TISS fee structure. The Course fee amount will be collected by CSIBER which will maintain separate accounts for the same.

Fees/Cost per Student

The course fee for this Certificate in Youth Leadership & Social Change is 11000/- and Diploma in Youth Leadership and Social Change is 21,000/-. The Course Fee will

cover all expenses of teaching, reading material etc. The Programm Co-ordinator will be paid by **CSIBER** as per existing norms.

Sharing

TISS and CSIBER_will jointly decide on an amount to be shared equally for administrative work including holding meetings, travel for monitoring and field visits, assessments, trainings etc.

TISS Charges

From the CSIBER TISS will receive at least Rs.3000/- per student irrespective of the fee charged by them. If no fee is charged then these charges will be based upon the cost per student as stated in the budget. Where the fees / amount per student is above Rs.10,000/-, the partner organization will pay 20 per cent of the total fee collected. Whichever is higher will prevail. The amount will be paid within 45 working days from the start of the course.

Review

The fee structure will be reviewed on an annual basis by the Advisory Committee of Centre for Lifelong Learning (CLL) in consultation with the Steering Committee and approval of Academic Council.

VI. Academic

Criteria for Selection

Criteria for selection of the students will be as approved for the Certificate / Diploma by the Academic Council of TISS. The current criterion for admission is minimum. Reservations for SC/ST/OBC according to the norms of University Grant Commission will be binding

Final Selection

The anchor person from TISS as well as from CSIBER will be involved in final selection of the students. In case interviews are necessary, the interview panel will have representation from both TISS & CSIBER unless otherwise decided by the Steering Committee. The decision to disqualify or rusticate a student will be taken by the Steering Committee.

Course Content

The course content for the Certificate & Diploma in Youth Leadership and Social Change has been approved by the Advisory Committee of Center for Lifelong Learning and / or the Academic Council of TISS. In case any changes in the curriculum are required, the members of Steering Committee or CLL Advisory Committee can call for a meeting not later than three months before the start of the first semester, of the course.

Responsibility

TISS will guide CSIBER in preparing the academic calendar and Partner Organisation will implement the calender.

Policy for Placement

The policy for placement will be jointly designed by TISS and CSIBER and

has to be approved by the Steering Committee. Field placement and final placement of students will be the responsibility of CSIBER TISS can suggest agencies within its network for placement of students.

Quality of teacher

A mechanism to monitor the quality of teachers will be suggested by the Steering Committee and implemented by CSIBER.

Moderation Committee

A Moderation Committee responsible for monitoring the field work of the students will be formed by CSIBER which will involve field supervisors and the Programme Coordinator of CSIBER

Assessment

The method of assessment of students will be decided by the respective faculty. However, the number of assessment units, weightage per assessment unit, grading scheme and requirement for credit fulfillment in any course will be based on TISS assessment norms. The question papers will be set by the faculty and approved by the anchor person from CSIBER and TISS

Access to TISS Library

Faculty of the Certificate & Diploma in Youth Leadership and Social Change will have access to TISS library and will be able to use the resources of the library to enrich the content of the courses.

VII. Interpretation Clause

Clauses

In the event of conflict of opinion with regard to interpretation of Regulations or the Rules of the School, the opinion of Director, TISS shall be final. In the event of a conflict of opinion with regard to interpretation of the agreement or these Rules and Regulations or the Bye Laws, the opinion of the Governing Board Member of TISS shall prevail.

VIII. Amendment of Rules

Rules

These Rules and Regulations of the Centre may be altered, varied, extended, revoked or abridged at any time by resolutions passed by a majority of the members of the Governing Board, present at the meetings of the Governing Board; which shall have been duly convened for the purpose, and the procedures followed as laid down in Section 12 of the Societies Registration Act 1860 (XXI of 1860); after receipt of concurrence of the UGC and the Institute

IX Institute to be a Juristic Person

Judicial Role

The Tata Institute of Social Sciences shall be a juristic person and shall have a perpetual succession, as also a common seal, and will sue and be sued in its own name.

X Institute Open to all classes, creeds and castes

Equality

The institute shall be open to all persons irrespective of their race, creed or caste, gender, sexual orientation, HIV status and disability and it shall not be lawful for the Institute to adopt or impose on any person any test whatsoever of religious belief or profession in order to entitle her/ him to be admitted thereto; as a member of the academic staff or non teaching staff or student body; or to hold any office therein; or to graduate there at, or to enjoy or exercise any privilege thereof; except, in respect of any particular benefaction accepted by the Institute, where such test is made a condition there of by any testamentary or other instrument creating such benefaction.
