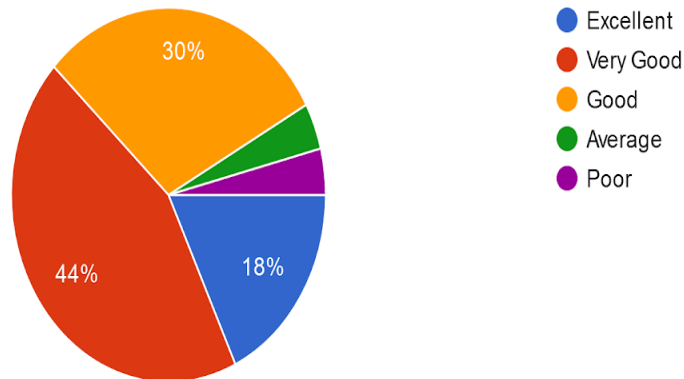

Q.1. How do you rate the syllabus of the courses that you have studied in relation to the competencies expected out of the course.

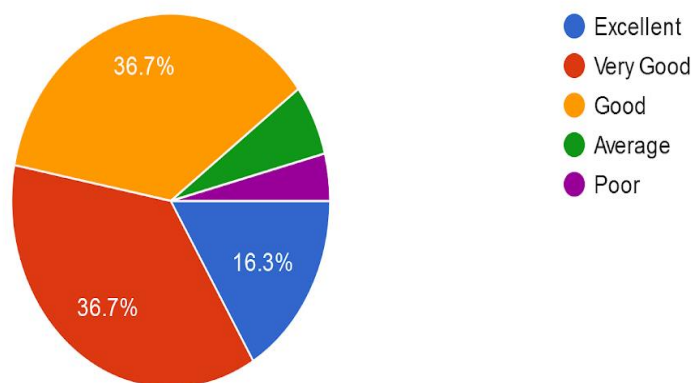

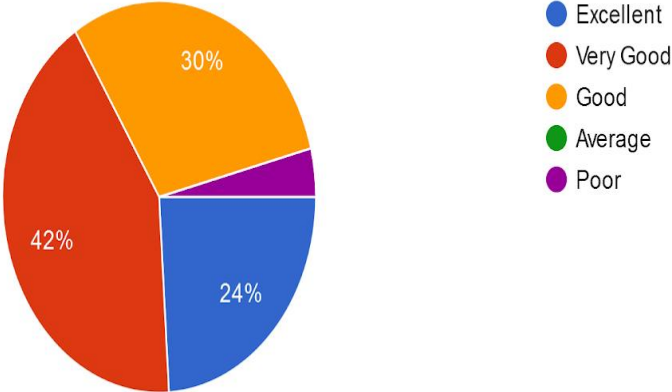

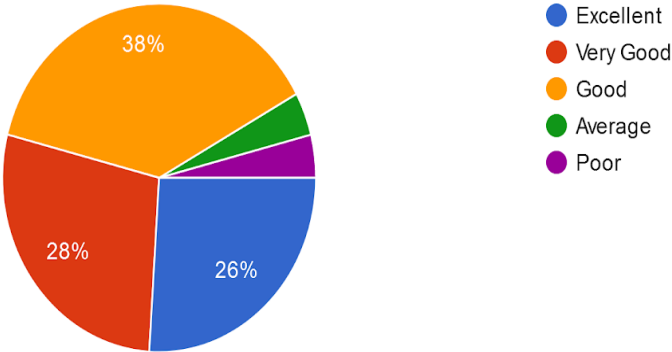

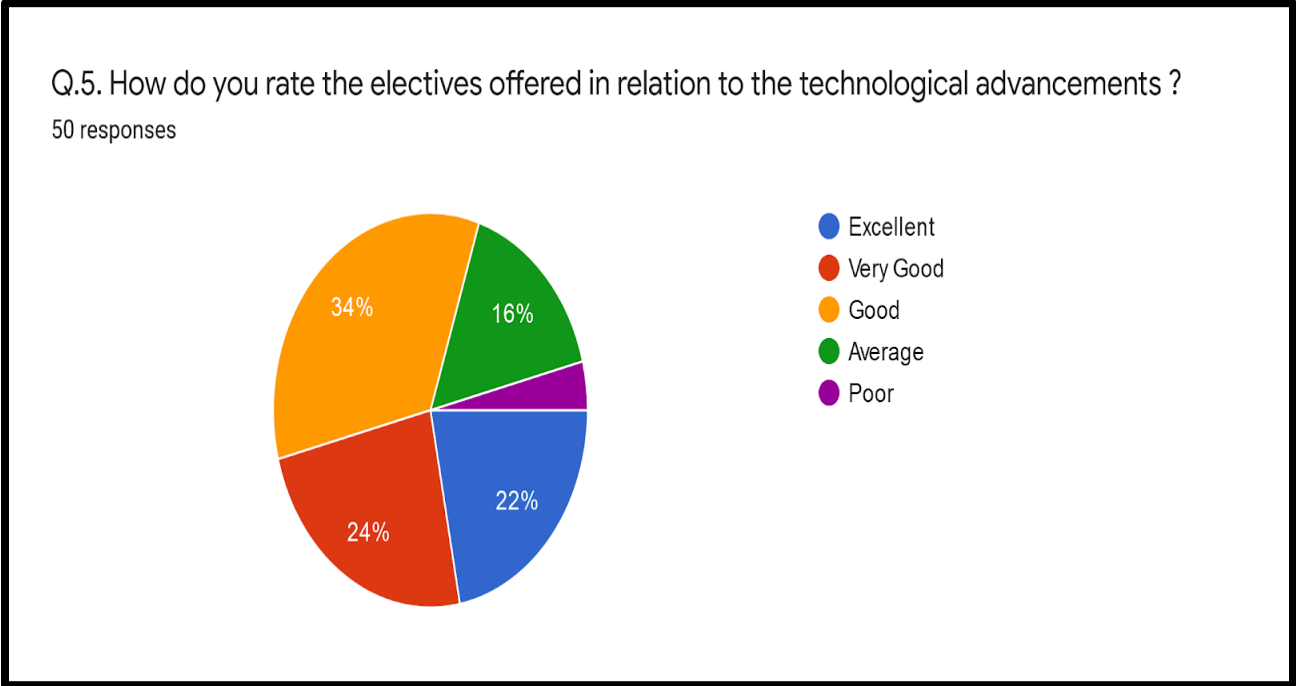

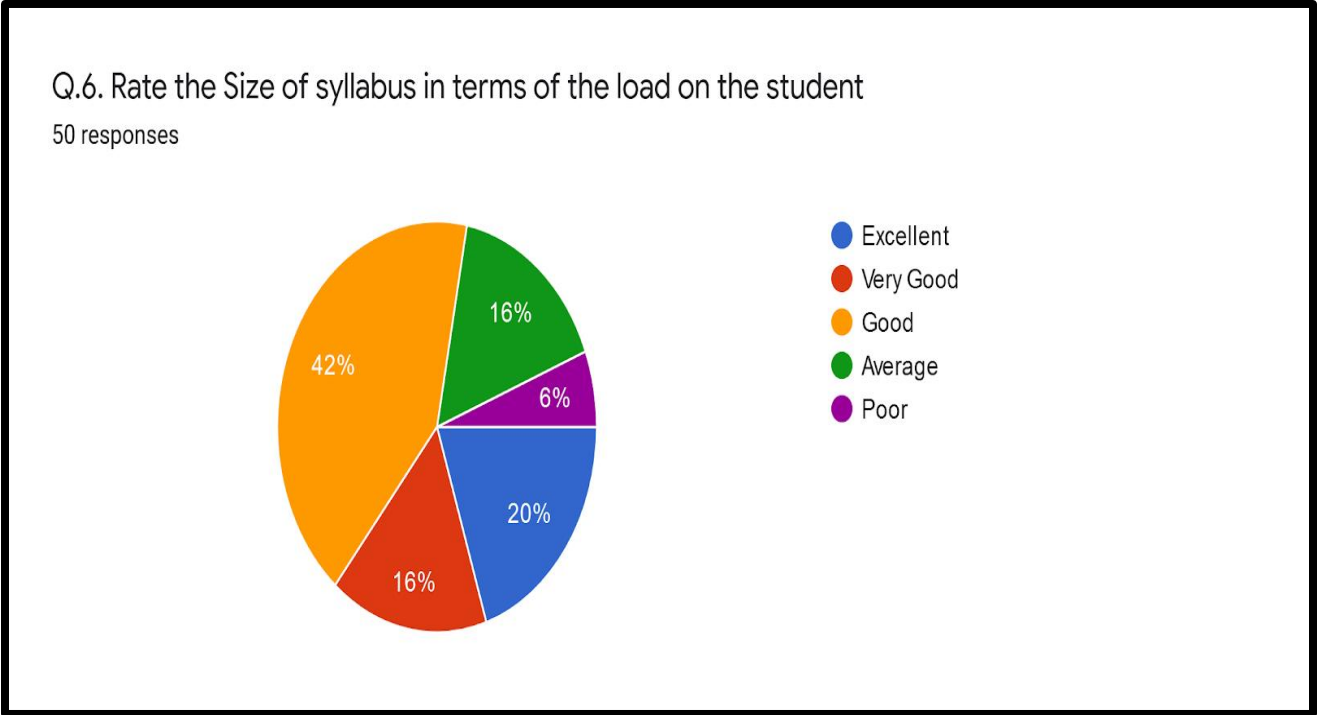

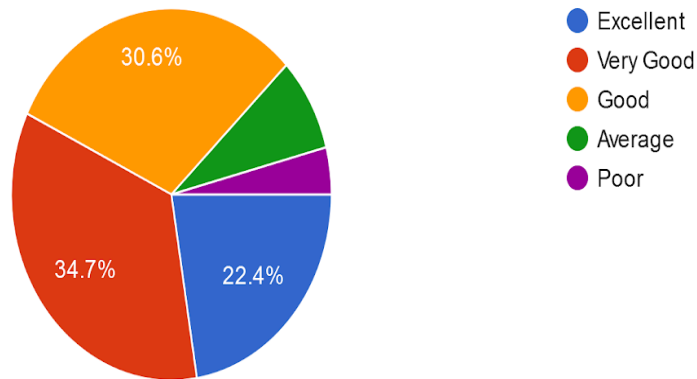

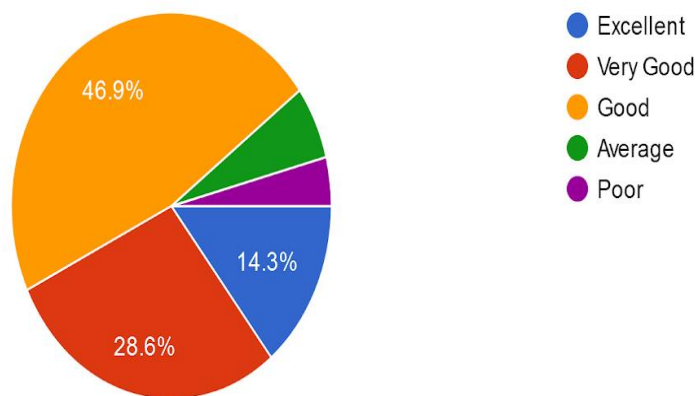

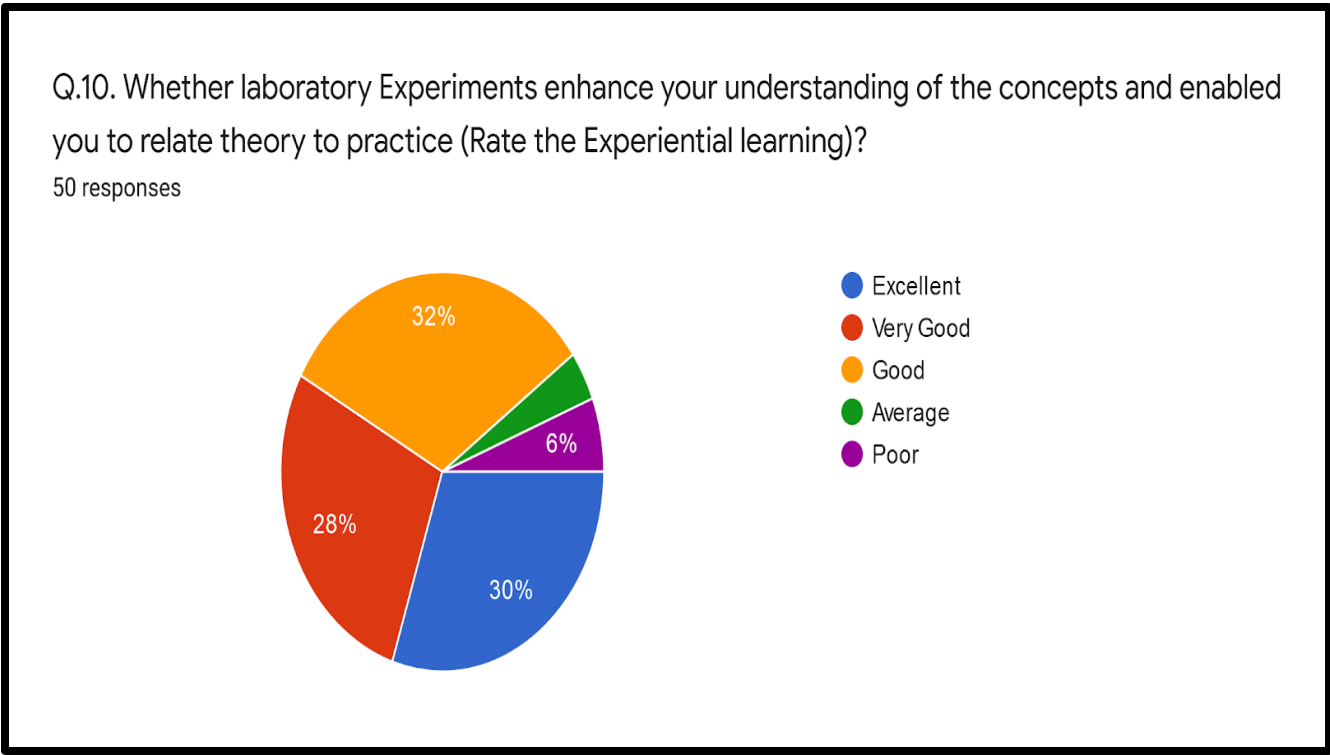

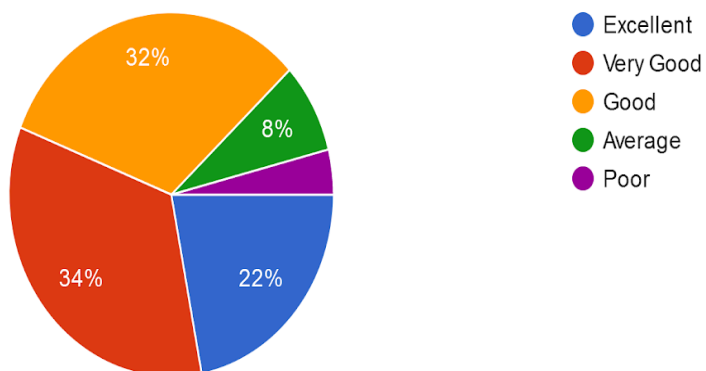

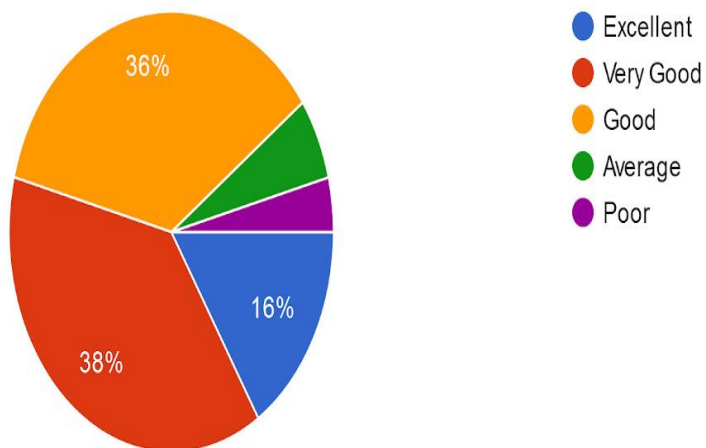
