Preamble

Working in an environment that is hazard free is not a choice — it is the right of all employees. Today, with more and more women joining the workforce, companies and organizations need to ensure that their establishments are safe so that their women employees feel secure and can work at ease. One of the greatest threats to impair this feeling of security is sexual harassment at the workplace. The challenges associated with this practice are immense and can have adverse ramifications if they are not handled carefully.

STUDENT COUNSELLING

The Counselling Cell of CSIBER College provides Personal and Vocational Guidance to the students of all Departments of College. Personal Counselling sessions are conducted at the centre by qualified and experienced counsellor to help students to resolve any kind of problems that they might face. The students are handled on a one- to- one basis where the counsellor brings utterly non- judgemental attitude to the table.

Besides Academic and Career related problems, personal issues are also dealt with. Confidentiality is a legal requirement of counselling and is strictly maintained. Thus, the counselling cell provides a platform for students to pursue both their professional and personal goals with greater self –awareness, self –esteem, understanding and focus. The counselling services are provided at Room Number 11, Department of Social Work, on every Wednesday and Friday 12pm to 4 pm.

Confidence issues, choosing the right career path, making choices in the various parts of life, self-doubt, pressure, relationship issues, poor coping abilities, maladjustment, family problems stress, anxiety, depression etc. are the issues that young people often face. Per week 8-to -10 students seek help and guidance from counsellor.

The sessions are dealt on one-to-one basis and privacy is strictly maintained. If any clinical or psychiatric emergency occurs or any help is needed in this regard, then the referral services are made available to the students for intervention.

Counselling cell conducts activities like Art Therapy, workshops on stigma reduction and students actively participate in world mental health day program by preparing posters and spreading awareness through poster exhibition.

Every student of every department is welcome and all students are free to avail the counselling services.
