#### 3) Autonomous Status and Accreditation:

The Autonomous Status was granted in the year June 1995 by the Shivaji University, Kolhapur and UGC in concurrence with Government of Maharashtra. The Autonomous Status has been extended by Shivaji University for period of six years i.e. 2011-12 to 2016-17 vide letter no. SU/PG. AFFI/Autonomous/3395, 17/07/2012. The Institute has undertaken number of academic and extracurricular activities during the year 2017-18.

It gives us immense pleasure to inform that CSIBER has been re-accredited for five years and awarded "A" grade (Institutional CGPA Score: 3.19) by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), Bangalore vide its letter no. NAAC/A&A/Outcome/2010 dt. 26<sup>th</sup> April 2010. The committee visited the Institute between 18<sup>th</sup> – 20<sup>th</sup> March 2010.

The admissions for the Academic year 2017-18, started with advertisement for admission to various courses in local and national news papers from November 2014 for MBA - ATMA Examination and for all other courses from April & May 2015. The students response for admission to the courses was encouraging. All the admissions were done on merit basis by following the Government Rules of reservation. The academic activities were carried out rigorously during the year and the total number of working days for the programmes varied between 190 to 200 days excluding the days for examinations. Special programmes were conducted to enhance the communication skills of the students. For weak students extra classes were engaged. CSIBER faculty has accepted the challenge to train and mould the students into efficient human capital for growth of the individuals and the country. At the same time the management of the Institute volunteered to enter into agreement with Cambridge University Press for introducing a compulsory course entitled BEC (Business English Certification). The fees of Rs. 3000/- per student are borne by the CSIBER Trust. In addition to regular academic activities, extracurricular activities for students were also conducted. The placement activities in the year were quite encouraging and students were placed in different business organizations, NGOs and Cooperatives. The MBA & MCA placements were good and encouraging.

The faculty members were encouraged to join Refresher Courses, Seminars, Conferences, Workshops and Training Programmes, which facilitated the interface with outside world. The meetings of all committees were conducted as per schedule and wherever necessary syllabi were changed taking into consideration the changing socio-economic and political environment of the country.

#### 4) **CPE and Progress:**

The imagination, new ideas and innovations at CSIBER under able guidance of Late Hon. President Prof. Dr. A.D. Shinde culminated in CSIBER achieving an enviable status of "College with Potential for Excellence" (CPE) by UGC, New Delhi". (F.No.17-25/2006 (NS/PE), dt. 29<sup>th</sup> May 2006 and D.O. No. F-12-1-2004 (vol. II) (NSPE), dt. 28<sup>th</sup> September 2006. The CPE status continued for the second phase too,k 2010-15. Finally, under the 12<sup>th</sup> Plan period 2015-20 the UGC, New Delhi has conferred the CPE status under third phase. The most significant achievement of 2016-17 academic year is that the CSIBER achieved the academic excellence A+grade, reaccredited by NAAC, Bangalore

To maintain high standards and high performance of an Institute imparting professional education, three things are most important. Firstly, continuous development of faculty through workshops/ seminars/ research and faculty development programmes. Secondly, the infrastructural development and use of latest technology in teaching pedagogy. And lastly, placement of students. During the academic year 2017-18, the Institute's achievements and progress on the above mentioned three criteria was commendable. Details of the individual department activities and events organized are presented in the departmental reports.



#### 15.0 In Brief Mention the Efforts Made & Assessment on The Following Criteria.

#### i) Curriculum Aspects

Care is taken to update the syllabus as per the requirement of the industry. Hence constant industry Institute interaction is undertaken. The faculty members keep a watch and undertake the survey of the curriculum aspects adopted at the national level Institute, accordingly the syllabus is revised as and when the situation demands.

Alumni visits the Institute occasionally and suggests the Chairman, respective faculty regarding the updation accordingly. This feedback is communicated to the faculties in the meeting and open debate takes place. Based on the debate and authenticity of feedback the informal decision is taken. It gets formalized through BOS and Academic Council meetings. To further formalize and strengthen the process Alumni is officially registered.

#### **Teaching Learning and Evaluation**

The teaching activity is strictly adhered as per the approved calendar. Director of the Institute visits the class rooms without prior information and solicit the feedback from the students regarding the teaching and understanding by the students.

Similarly the formal feedback is taken with the help of 'Software' at MBA computer lab.

Each individual faculty member adopts his own method of taking feedback to achieve the teaching learning objective. The class coordinators and class representatives have a frequent interaction to get the feedback.

Students are evaluated on continuous basis – through internal assessment system as well trimester term end examination. In this process the weak students are identified and remedial classes are held to make teaching learning effective and upgrade the students. The remedial classes are conducted before the term end examination. To keep track of effective teaching learning process the faculty member interact with the students, mentor the students and counsel the students regularly.

For effective and efficient teaching the management takes cognizance of faculty development. Hence the faculty members are deputed to various premier Institutes wherever the refresher courses / FDP's / QIP's / MDP's / Seminars / Workshop's/ Symposium are conducted. Faculty members in groups are also deputed to premier Institutes to upgrade knowledge regarding recent trends in these subjects as well as to have cross cultural exchange of ideas and teaching pedagogies. Many a times the senior faculty members mentor, guide the junior faculty members regarding effective teaching.

#### ii) Research Consultancy and Extension

Faculty members are actively involved not only in teaching but also in research, consultancy and extension activities.

Extension services are in the form of guest lectures by faculty members organized by various NGO's, Rotary clubs and social organizations. Extension activities for the students on the campus is in the form of meditation and Yoga classes oragnised at the Boys Hostel as well as auditorium of Institute.

#### iii) Infrastructure and Learning Resources

The Institute has set up Video Conferencing facility and few sessions through this facility has been carried out.


#### iv) Student Support & Progression

For the progress of the student all possible academic support is extended. The weak students are given extra tutoring to bring them on par with the other students. The concept of SDLL and CPSD is adopted and implanted for the entire student community of MBA. Students weak in oral communication are guided through language laboratory. Students are given an opportunity to organize and conduct various events such as welcome, farewell, seminars, guest lectures etc.

#### vi) Innovative Practices

#### A] MSW PROGRAMME:

#### **Admission Activities:**

The admission process for MSW course 2017-18 begun with advertisement for MSW admission in daily news papers viz. Pudhari, Lokmat, Maharashtra Times, Times of India, published during 3<sup>rd</sup> week of May and second week of June, 2017.

Total no of applicants : 220

No. of students appeared : 213

No. of students selected : 120

(Category wise list - table follows)

No. of Students selected against Cancellation : 11

In all 220 applications were received and out of which 213 candidates appeared for entrance test scheduled on 28/6/2017 and subsequently personal interviews were held on the same day from 2pm onwards. Written Examination was conducted in 8 blocks. The written paper consisted of objective type (80 marks) and descriptive type questions (20 marks). Personal interviews (50 marks) were conducted by eight panels, consisting of faculty members of social work. Out of 213 students, 6 candidates did not appear for interview.

Hence 207 candidates were considered for selection. The entrance examination and personal interview marks were consolidated by Dr. P.S. Randive, Dr. S.V. Shirol and Dr.D.M.Bhosale and Dr. K. Pradeep Kumar.

The merit list was prepared, (with the help of EXCEL software) by strictly following the Government of Maharashtra admission norms and Shivaji University guidelines. Accordingly 50 percent open seats were filled from consolidated merit list consisting of all the 207 eligible applicants. The reserved category candidates who are selected under the first merit list were treated as open category (as per rule). The remaining 50 percent seats were exclusively allotted to the recognized reservation categories as per Government rules and selection was based on merit. The vacant seats against reserved category are filled by other reservation category based on merit.

The Gender wise, Caste wise and University wise distribution of applicants is given below. All the 11 teachers were included in the entire process of admission.

#### 17.0 In Brief Mention the Efforts made & Assessment on the following Criteria

#### i) Curriculum Aspects:

Care is taken to update the syllabus as per the requirement of the industry. Hence constant industry Institute interaction is undertaken. The faculty members keep a watch and under take the survey of the curriculum aspects adopted at the national level Institute, accordingly the syllabus is revised as and when the situation demands.

Alumni visits the Institute occasionally and suggests the Chairman, respective faculty regarding the updation accordingly. This feedback is communicated to the faculties in the meeting and open debate takes place. Based on the debate and authenticity of feedback the

informal decision is taken. It gets formalized through BOS and Academic Council meetings. To further formalize and strengthen the process Alumni is officially registered.

#### ii) Teaching, Learning & Evaluation:

The teaching activity is strictly adhered as per the approved calendar. Director of the Institute visits the class rooms without prior information and solicit the feedback from the students regarding the teaching and understanding by the students.

Similarly the formal feedback is taken with the help of 'Software' at MBA computer lab.

Each individual faculty member adopts his own method of taking feedback to achieve the teaching learning objective. The class coordinators and class representatives have a frequent interaction to get the feedback.

Students are evaluated on continuous basis – through internal assessment system as well trimester term end examination. In this process the weak students are identified and remedial classes are held to make teaching learning effective and upgrade the students. The remedial classes are conducted before the term end examination. To keep track of effective teaching learning process the faculty member interact with the students, mentor the students and counsel the students regularly.

For effective and efficient teaching the management takes cognizance of faculty development. Hence the faculty members are deputed to various premier Institutes wherever the refresher courses / FDP's / QIP's / MDP's / Seminars / Workshop's/ Symposium are conducted. Faculty members in groups are also deputed to premier Institutes to upgrade knowledge regarding recent trends in these subjects as well as to have cross cultural exchange of ideas and teaching pedagogies. Many a times the senior faculty members mentor, guide the junior faculty members regarding effective teaching.

#### iii) Research Consultancy & Extension:

Faculty members are actively involved not only in teaching but also in research, consultancy and extension activities.


The Institute has set up Video Conferencing facility and few sessions through this facility has been carried out.

The Institute uses "Libsys Software" for library. The Computer record shows that there were **37,202** book transactions (check-out & check-in) and 321 transactions on Identity Cards. The library remained open on 230 working days between 9.00 am to 7.00 pm. In the academic year 2017-18 total number of visits of the Faculty & students to library is **49,387** (Students Visits-48,418 & Faculty Visits-969).

The library has independent Study Hall for 120 students. Under the "Earn and Learn Scheme" Ten students were working in the Library. The study hall is kept open from 7.00a.m. To 11.00p.m. Text-book facilities are provided to the students in the Study Hall.

The Institute subscribes Online E-Resources. These include *N-LIST Inflibnet*, *EBSCO*, *J-Gate* and *Prowess (CMIE) Database* & 147 Paper-back Journals and Magazines in which Five are foreign Journals. The periodical section has seating capacity of 60 readers and is open between 9.00a.m. To 7.00p.m.

The library provides Book Bank facility for the students especially for the Backward Class students. It issued books to the students who demanded book bank facility. Seventy-Eight M.Phil & Ph.D. research candidates from other institutions and colleges visited the Library for reference work & study.

The inter-Library loan facilities are made available on demand to other Colleges.

"Anand Granth Mohotsav" was organized during 1<sup>st</sup> to 3<sup>rd</sup> February 2018 and Twenty-five publishers and Book Sellers opened their book stalls. The "Anand Granth Mohotsav" was visited by the students, teachers and parents. CSIBER Library made purchases of books on the recommendations of the teachers and students.

Training programmes for students & Faculty were organized in *EBSCO & Prowess (CMIE) Database* training. At the beginning of academic year 2017-18 Orientation about use of library was given to the students by Dr. Babu Zachariah.

#### 1.0 Infrastructure

- a) The hostel building has three floors and on each there are 22 rooms.
- b) There are in all 71 rooms available in the hostel. Out of that 6 rooms are single occupancy rooms while 3 rooms are 4 occupancy rooms and rest of the 62 are double occupancy rooms.
- c) The intake capacity of the boys Hostel is 185.
- d) Each room is provided with a fan and tube light.
- e) Efforts are made to add aesthetic value by placing the posters in the Verandahs.
- f) Each student is given a table and a chair.
- g) A small garden is being developed in the premises of the hostel.
- h) Canteen facilities are available to the students. However the inmates are free to select canteen or outside mess for meals.
- i) Common Hall is available for students activity. One CTV is installed in the Hall.

#### 2.0 Academic Ambience:-

Academic ambience is taken care of by providing blackboard, tables and chairs in the common room. Daily Newspapers The Times of India, Economic Times, Business Express along with local dailies are subscribed. In order to facilitate Meetings with the all inmates of the hostel are conducted on periodic basis.

#### 3.0 Water Facility:-

- a) Drinking water is made available to the inmates by installing the Water purifier on each floor.
- b) The water for recreation purpose is provided through the Overhead tank. Water is available for 24 hours. Besides that there is Ground water tank situated near to the hostel building as a reserve.
- c) Hot Water through solar system:- In the year 2009-10 solar water heating system has been installed. This hot water is sufficient for the hostel inmates.

#### 4.0 Medical Facility:-

- a) Sports Medical Facility is provided to the inmates in the medical room which is situated at the Ground Floor.
- b) First Aid Medical Facility is provided in the hostel.
- c) In this year, two students were seriously ill who were admitted by the hostel Authority.

#### **Sports Facility:-**

- a) Sports material is given to the inmates. Material like Football, Basketball, Chess, Carom, Tennis Table is provided.
- b) The material like dumbbells provided for physical exercise. The bar is made available outside the hostel for exercise.

#### 5.0 Activities at the hostel:-

- a) With consensus of the inmates, festivals such as Ganesh Festival, Christmas, Shivjayanti, Rangpanchami,31<sup>st</sup> December are celebrated in the Hostel.
- b) CSIBER Boy's Hostel Day was celebrated in the Boys Hostel. Welcome as well as Farewell Function was arranged first time in the Hostel. On that occasion the sports activities were conducted and prizes were distributed to the students and it was followed by the dinner.

#### 6.0 Maintenance of the Building:-

- a) Every year, in the summer vacation broken glass panels are fixed.
- b) Regular maintenance of the water leakage, carpentry work, electric repairs are carried out in the hostel.
- c) Water tank cleaning is done after every six months using cleaning machinery.
